

# JPSO Crime Tracker | HOW TO Guide

## JPSO CRIME TRACKER


**Step 1: Select a date range for your search. The mapping on the site is limited to the past three years of records and allows the user to search a maximum of up to 90 days at a time to limit the records returned and to maintain performance.**

**Step 2: Select the desired crime categories by either selecting the item and clicking the plus button, or by dragging the item to the right box.**
